OVERVIEW

- Archivist roles with 58 professionals recently changing jobs and a median tenure of 1 year reflects frequent job-switching. This is likely due to limited career progression.
- The profession's appeal to women with 66% female dominated may relate to the nature of the work or industry trends.
- Despite high job mobility, hiring demand is low, possibly due to market saturation or slow growth.

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

Top Locations in Australia

WHAT ARE THE TOP LOCATIONS FOR THIS TALENT?

- Greater Sydney and Melbourne lead in archivist talent, with 170 and 154 professionals respectively. Melbourne's higher growth rate (+5%) suggests increasing demand in this area, likely driven by expanding cultural and educational institutions.
- Brisbane and Perth show moderate growth, with 50 and 41 professionals. Perth's significant growth (+8%) reflects the potential for emerging opportunities in the region.
- Canberra sees notable growth (+11%) despite a smaller talent pool, likely due to the city's government and national archival institutions.

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

Industry Sectors

WHAT INDUSTRIES ARE EMPLOYING THIS TALENT?

- Education sectors employ the largest number of professionals, though Higher Education is seeing a decline (-6%), while Primary/Secondary Education is experiencing high demand (+9%), driven by growing digital archiving needs in schools.
- Information Services show consistent demand, with growth in information services (+10%), likely due to the rising importance of digital information management in public and private sectors.
- Non-profit and cultural institutions (Museums, Historical Sites, Religious Institutions) are seeing strong growth, especially in non-profits (+42%), as these sectors expand their focus on preserving heritage and digital records.


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ARCHIVIST Industry Skills

WHAT ARE THE MOST COMMON SKILLS AMONG THIS TALENT?

- Archival Preservation is the most prevalent skill (87% of professionals), reflecting the growing importance of safeguarding physical and digital records, especially in institutions focused on long-term preservation.
- Archives Management and Record Keeping are also common skills (59% and 50%, respectively), likely driven by the need for efficient data organization and compliance with legal and historical standards.
- Gender Gap: Female professionals dominate these skills, especially in areas like Genealogy and Archival Processing, where the gender gap reaches up to 50%, suggesting these roles may appeal more to women due to the nature of the work.
