
Library Manager



WHAT ARE THE TOP LOCATIONS FOR THIS TALENT?

- Greater Melbourne Area and Greater Sydney Area lead in talent concentration with 126 and 108 professionals, respectively. These cities are key economic and cultural hubs, attracting talent for diverse library management opportunities.
- Gold Coast shows the highest growth at +11%, driven by expanding educational institutions and population growth in the area, creating new demand for skilled library professionals.
- Greater Brisbane Area and Greater Canberra Area are experiencing a decline in talent, with -3% and -9% growth, likely due to limited job openings and competitive hiring environments.



- Health Care and Community Development are seeing rapid growth, driven by expanding services in these sectors.
- Information Services and Primary/Secondary Education show steady growth, indicating ongoing demand in both public and private sectors.

- Library Management and Information Literacy are critical for around two-thirds of professionals, reflecting the need for leadership and digital expertise.
- Traditional skills like Library Science and Cataloging remain important, though slightly less common, as libraries balance old and new technologies.
